

A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE



Today is the 4th day of Elul as I write this message, and that means that the High Holy Days have already begun. For it is in the month before Rosh Hashana that we are to begin the process of introspection, reflection, repentance, and even

repair. Even though Rosh Hashana is 3 ½ weeks away, it still seems distant. Every day, the story changes. Every day, we prepare to pivot, to activate our newly learned skill of being “nimble.” Every day, we try to make decisions that we know will need to be adjusted tomorrow.

Last High Holy Days, we anticipated being back together as a community in our sanctuary. We knew the world would be different, but not like this. Every day, I watch my colleagues and their congregations one-by-one make the decision to return to fully online services. I wonder, as I write this message, if we will have made that decision by the time you read this. In any case, I know our physical sanctuary will not be full. And I also know that Temple Emanuel Sinai’s sacred space continues to expand far beyond the walls of our building. We will experience our High Holy Days together as a community. We know how to do this.

I recently came across a meaningful book – two volumes actually – titled, *When We Turned Within: Reflections on Covid-19* compiled and edited by Rabbi Menachem Creditor. In this moment, one poem especially spoke to me.

When Will Morning Come...

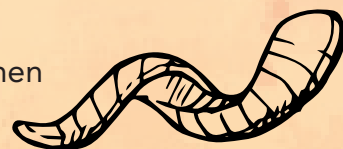
(Inspired by Psalm 5) By Jacob Niemi

To the One who conducts flowing rivers
and the buzzing of bees;
a song for the beloved.
Who will heed my unspoken words?
Who will understand my silent murmurings?
Who will listen when I cry out,

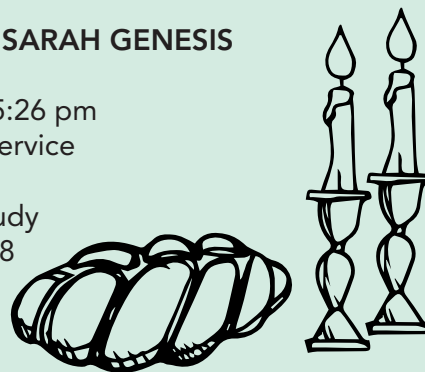

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



LET GEORGE DO IT!

When I was a junior high school student, I had a gym teacher who had a profound influence on me, and not as an athlete...of which I'm **quite** the opposite. Mrs. Prescott was a force. She was a member of a most prominent family, a family that did much for our community. She probably didn't need to work, but she chose to teach school. It was the perfect choice, as she had much to offer us as young women.

Besides being the girls' gym teacher, she also taught English classes. Teachers very often did "double duty" in those days (I'm not sure what a union would say about that). Picture white sneakers and ankle socks worn with a pleated skirt and a sweatshirt thrown over a lovely blouse. But it wasn't the fashion statement she made or her family's prominence that made an impression. It was her complete dedication and common sense – her **sense** of community.

When we were out on a schoolyard field playing softball or volleyball, or inside in the gym playing basketball, or whatever sport required us to work as a team, Mrs. Prescott insisted on the spirit and cohesiveness that made us a team. She wanted us to work together. If you were an outfielder and you watched a ball sail by you and made no effort to catch it, chase it, or retrieve it, she'd yell out, "That's right! Let George do it!"

Well of course there was no George in a girls' gym class, but we got the point. Nothing happens if you stand and watch. Nothing happens if you're not a team – a community.

As I grew older, and maybe now more than ever, I thought of Mrs. Prescott and "George." It was not her family's means that was an impression, but their community service, their **time** given. They gave of their **time** willingly and often. My father liked to say that **time**, however short it may be, given to the community is as if you have given money.

We have members in this community who are like Mrs. Prescott in that they give their **time**...they never leave it to George to do. They run for the ball every time: honors on Shabbat and the High Holy Days, helping park cars in the lot and making folks feel safe during a service, helping on committees, leading Torah Study and an occasional service...**just showing up**. This is what makes us a community, a place where we support each other and control our enjoyment of the community.

I sincerely hope that in the New Year which we will soon be celebrating, and, as the pandemic eases and we come back together, we will **really** come together as a community. I'm hoping we will all step up and lend ourselves ...**our** time ... to this community of ours, and that we won't "just let George do it."

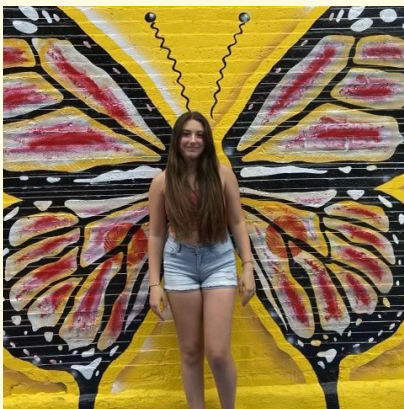


Jacob Charles Horne
