



A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE

I remember during my first couple of years as a rabbi in Memphis, I would marvel when my senior rabbi would apply a Jewish text to the immediate conversation taking place, seemingly out of nowhere. The text flowed from his mental library of texts with ease, a spontaneous comment. I couldn't imagine doing the same. He was only 10 years my senior.

Now, after 25 years as a rabbi, so much has changed in the rabbinate and synagogue life in general that my ability to share impromptu texts is only one small part.

During my time as a rabbi, some of the things I have seen are...

- The entrepreneurship of the rabbinate: rabbis creating their own organizations to serve the Jewish people in innovative ways.
- More rabbis embracing the need to officiate at interfaith weddings and doing so with an open and willing heart.
- The Central Conference of American Rabbis confirming that rabbis have the right to decide for themselves at whose weddings they will officiate, especially supporting their rabbis' right to officiate at LGBTQ weddings long before it was civilly legal.
- The attention given to diversity in our congregations and our world, especially but not limited to creating a sense of belonging for Jews of Color.
- The rise on non-denominationalism: people being less concerned about the ideology of a synagogue and more interested in which community feels like home, where they feel like they belong, the quality of what the synagogue offers, and where their friends – or potential friends – attend.
- September 11, January 6, Charlottesville, October 7... plus the rise of school and mass shootings, and increased antisemitism leading to violent acts; all events that changed the face of how synagogues approach security today.
- Incredible changes in technology and how synagogues communicate; going from paper files to digital, phone calls to text messages, and print marketing to social media; visual t'filah (projection of prayers during services) and live-streaming/zooming events – just to name a few.
- A greater desire for conversion to Judaism, more than we've ever seen before; so much so that some rabbis can't even handle the increased demands on their time.
- Covid and its impact on Jewish life.

This year, I am celebrating 10 years of serving as your rabbi at Temple Emanuel Sinai. Almost half my career – 2/5 or 40% to be precise. Most of the changes listed above have happened during these past ten years. We've had to be a nimble congregation to respond to the changes and work toward meeting the needs of our community, within the synagogue and the Jewish community in general.

Meanwhile, we have seen a "renaissance" take place in Worcester, a renewal of arts and culture, business interests, non-profit organizational creativity, and people finding their home in our city and the surrounding areas. A renaissance that Covid may have slowed down but couldn't stop. Temple Emanuel Sinai can only benefit from this new life growing around us.

I am proud to be part of this congregation, one that looks toward the uncertain future and instead of locking down, starts a Futuring Committee.

Thank you for ten years – so far – of growth and learning, community and friendship, standing by each other in both joys and challenges.



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

With stories told around holiday tables, and with the ability to research ancestry and genealogy with commercially available DNA testing, we have been able to learn from where we have come. Similarly, we have the history of the 10 years of our merged Emanuel Sinai community and the "genealogy" of the founding synagogues, Emanuel and Sinai, to understand where we are now. What we cannot predict from this history is where we are going. Past performance does not allow us to anticipate future outcomes.

For many, their vision of involvement in synagogue life includes religious services and the education of our students. This, unfortunately is a myopic perspective. It does not recognize

the activities of our affinity groups, mahjong, art group, hiking group, and singing groups, for example, or program planning through our multitude of committees, be they holiday events or educational programs on antisemitism awareness, Israel, and programs sponsored through our Lifelong Learning initiative.

As a living organization, we are always in a process of growth, covering new ground as the world changes around us. Over the last year, members of the congregation, with the advice of the Rabbi, have begun to engage in envisioning our future. The synagogue model of our parents and grandparents will not meet our future needs. Communication methods have changed from traditional postal service notices to a variety of digital platforms, which transition every few years it seems to the next new platform. Engagement has evolved from in-person attendance to virtual attendance for worship events, meetings, and educational programs.

Our Futuring process has begun developing working groups to envision what TES will look like in five to ten years to be able to remain relevant to our members, and to enhance our relationship with Jewish life in our community.
