#### A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE

A Time for Honest Conversation

I can count on one hand the number of times I've scrapped my bulletin article at the last minute to write about a deep concern that's been taking up a lot of headspace. This is one of those times.

My original July/August piece on the healing power of art is still included on page 8 — it's a topic I care deeply about. But I've been consumed with how to address Israel and Palestine, Israelis and Palestinians, the Israel-Hamas Conflict, the Israeli War on Gaza... even what we call this situation sparks deep pain and disagreement. And that's true within our own congregation.

Recently, I've heard that some congregants feel Temple Emanuel Sinai has been silent on the issue. People are yearning for space to talk, to process, to share in a Jewish setting grounded in our values and our faith community.

The blessing — and the challenge — of our congregation is our diversity. Truly, what a gift to have built a home for people from so many different backgrounds, traditions, and viewpoints. But around this issue, our diversity stretches across a spectrum so vast that it sometimes feels like we're as numerous and scattered as "the sands of the sea and the stars in the sky," just as Genesis describes Abraham's descendants.

So what does it mean to say our synagogue has been "silent"? Perhaps we haven't created formal opportunities for open conversation. Perhaps we haven't said what some hoped to hear — whether that's more support for Israel and the return of the hostages, or stronger condemnation of the humanitarian crisis in Gaza caused by the Israeli government's actions. And when people say "we," they often mean me — the rabbi.

In my role, I've tried to speak my truth while also holding space for everyone to feel they belong. The truth is, I can't do both fully. I cannot speak my whole truth and also represent the full range of beliefs in our diverse congregation. No matter what I say, some will want to hear something else.

But I speak from a foundation of Jewish values: the sanctity of human life overrides everything. That means we must grieve and condemn the horrific crimes of October 7 — the murder of civilians, the taking of hostages, many still not returned. What person of faith could not be outraged by that?

And I also grieve and condemn the killing of Palestinian civilians, the displacement of families, and the denial of humanitarian aid. What person of faith could not feel the moral urgency of that?

I hold both truths at the same time.

Now is the time for conversation. A committee is working carefully to create a respectful, professionally facilitated space for that to happen. Is it taking longer than we'd like? Yes. But I've seen too many congregations rush into it and end up more divided than before.

We've heard you. I've heard you. And we're moving forward.

If you want to talk, I'm here. Let's meet — preferably over a cool drink during these hot summer days.

And finally, I invite you to read my recent Keeping the Faith column in the Telegram: "...As if they have saved the entire world: The case for turning away from destruction," published June 21, 2025, and available online.

#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Many have asked how I feel to have been elected President of Temple Emanuel Sinai at our recent annual meeting. It's a simple answer: I feel both humbled and proud to have been asked, I feel optimistic and enthusiastic about what is ahead for our congregation, I feel hopeful that we will each find opportunities to share ideas and work together to make this an even stronger, relevant community for our members, our prospective members, and our guests. A community of belonging, a community that supports each other, a community that reminds us of and reinforces our Jewish values.

As we look ahead to our High Holidays, I hope that I will have the opportunity to greet you at services if you will be joining us in the sanctuary, and also to greet you if you join online. I also invite you to include your family members, friends, anyone who is even a bit curious about Temple Emanuel Sinai. We have so much to be proud of.

I will endeavor to use this column to highlight the priorities of our Board and to share updates of our activities. If there are other ways you'd like me to use this column, I'm also open to feedback. I look forward to working together.





#### THE HEALING POWER OF CREATIVITY

"When you make art and you don't know what's going to happen, you're involved in the mystery that life really is... I've had to find ways to express that stirring, boiling within, to try to map the ever-moving ocean. That's where I think art is most healing." - Judy Tuwaletstiwa, Your Brain on Art

"The act of making art is both scary and healing... Making art, at any level, is an act of courage and an expression of faith."

- Julia Cameron, The Artist's Way

These reflections point to a powerful truth: art is healing. Whether rooted in neuroscience or spiritual exploration, creativity brings light into hidden places, both within and around us.

Over the past two years, I've had the privilege of completing a creative facilitator training through the Jewish Studio Project, a program devoted to exploring "Creative Health" — the intersection of creativity and well-being. (You can learn more at jewishstudioproject.org.)

That theme of creative health seems to have naturally emerged at TES this year. Juliet Feibel, Executive Director of ArtsWorcester and a TES congregant, gave a compelling talk at our Annual Meeting about the role of visual art in Judaism and everyday life.

Two of her insights are staying with me:

First, when you visit an art gallery or museum — and we should, often — give yourself permission to see just one gallery or exhibit. Instead of pushing yourself to take it all in (and feeling guilty when you tire out), allow yourself to truly experience just one space, deeply and joyfully.

Second, go with friends. Art is not only about individual reflection — it's also about shared experience. Going to a museum or gallery with others strengthens our connections and fosters belonging.

Building on Juliet's talk, we will launch our **2025 TES Summer Institute Series**, where TES members involved in the visual and performing arts will share their experiences through a Jewish lens during Shabbat services in July and August. The lineup includes a photographer, musician, educators, mixed-media artist, painter, dancer, and an art historian — a true celebration of the creativity in our community.

Throughout the year, we continue to nurture this spirit through our monthly Beit Omanut (Arts & Crafts Affinity Group), where we gather to work on individual projects and engage in free-flowing conversation. In February, we'll host guest artists for Arts Month, learning new techniques and exploring unfamiliar media. And we'll round out the year during our TES BMitzvah Anniversary Celebration (May 1–3) with a community art project: designing new covers for our Torah scrolls.

If God is the ultimate Creator, and we are made in the Divine image, then creativity is not optional — it's intrinsic. To make art, to appreciate it, to gather around it — these are acts of spiritual vitality. As Picasso once said, art "washes away from the soul the dust of everyday life."


