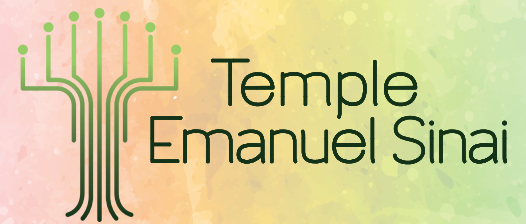

## A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE

As Rosh Hashana approaches and the New Year begins, Temple Emanuel Sinai enters a new stage in its life: the teenage years. This year we celebrate our 13th anniversary as a congregation. On May 1–3, 2026, we will mark this milestone with all the rituals of becoming B'Mitzvah—Shabbat services, Torah reading, music, learning, shared meals, and a community art project to create new covers for our sacred Torah scrolls.

Becoming a teenager is about independence, identity, and belonging. Teens deepen friendships, explore new interests, test boundaries, and begin to understand their place in the world. In many ways, that describes us as a congregation.

Our identity is becoming clearer. Years ago, a past president asked, “What is our *WHY*?” While we didn’t have a complete answer then, many responses returned to the same value: diversity. This year, we are focusing on being a **Community of Belonging**—a place where everyone feels secure, accepted, and included; where each of us knows we are valued, respected, and that our presence matters. A *kehillah kedoshah*—a holy community—where we support one another and connect to something greater than ourselves.

Like teenagers, we won’t always get it right. We will make mistakes. But the High Holy Days remind us that *teshuvah*—turning, repairing, and growing—is ongoing. When we stumble, we acknowledge, apologize, make amends, and change. To truly create a culture of belonging, we must practice this cycle with *chesed* and *rachamim*—kindness and compassion. Belonging is not a project with an end date. It’s not just our theme for this year or for our B’Mitzvah celebration. It is lifelong work, rooted in Jewish values. In *Pirkei Avot* 2:4, Hillel teaches: “Do not separate yourself from the community.” This reminds us of our responsibility to the community. But the text also turns us toward responsibility for one another: suspend judgment, choose words with care, repair when we cause harm, and never stop learning.

Each of us carries this obligation. Together, we can nurture a synagogue where all who enter know they belong.

## SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE

Social Action as a religious obligation is central to the Reform movement's contribution to contemporary Jewish life. Acting with others to make the world more fair, makes life more meaningful. At TES Social Action combines learning about Jewish ethics and Torah values, charitable giving and volunteerism, and effective advocacy in coalition to promote justice-informed public policy.

TES's Social Action Committee mirrors the Union for Reform Judaism's (URJ) Religious Action Center (RAC) as we help to shape our new state affiliate, RAC Massachusetts. Priority policy efforts this year will focus on affordable housing, climate disruption, the use of local resources in ICE's pursuit of migrants and refugees, and state regulation of computer-generated "ghost guns." Our charitable work will continue to focus mostly on hunger and homelessness.

SAC usually meets in person at TES and on Zoom at 7pm on the second Tuesday of each month. All are welcome!

Our Social Action Committee is continuing our traditional High Holy Day Food Drive. We are so grateful for your generous donations over the years, and this year, with the proposed cuts to food stamps our donations will be more critical than ever.

Building on previous years' success, we are again responding to community partners who have told us that it makes a big difference to the people they serve to receive food items and ingredients that fit their cultures. Many of these items are not usually found in the standard U.S. diet and are not often provided by food banks and pantries. Seasonings and spices are especially appreciated. Providing these items allows their client families to prepare meals and feed their families in ways that affirm their cultures and traditions.

The Food Drive will run from September 22 - October 15 – Rosh Hashana to Simchat Torah. We hope you and your family will participate and we thank you in advance!

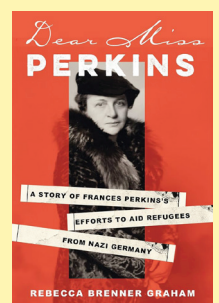

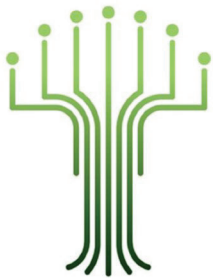
