A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE

Community for Chanukah


A parent recently came to me about an antisemitic incident their child experienced at school. Sadly, this conversation is not new for me as a rabbi. No matter where I've served, parents have shared stories like this—sometimes directly, sometimes only after the fact. I suspect there are more incidents than most of us realize. In this particular case, I was grateful that the school responded quickly and thoughtfully, which is not always the norm.

Together, the parent and I looked for resources for their child, for the student who made the hurtful comment, and for the school as a whole. We agreed that the goal shouldn't be to focus on Jews in particular, but rather to help students learn about the many ways people are different—and how we can celebrate those differences while still coming together as one community.

While exploring materials, I found a beautiful resource on the PJ Library website: The Christmas Menorahs: How a Town Fought Hate by Janice Cohn. First published 30 years ago and reissued recently, it tells the true story of how the people of Billings, Montana, came together in 1993 after a brick shattered a Jewish child's window during Hanukkah. In a powerful show of solidarity, thousands of residents—churches, civic groups, and neighbors—placed drawings and paper menorahs in their own windows. Their unity inspired what became the national "Not In Our Town" movement, which continues today to "stop hate, address bullying, and build safe, inclusive communities for all."

This, I believe, is what it means to be or *lagoyim*—a light to the nations. Do we have the courage and stamina to respond to hate not only by protecting ourselves but also by helping to make the world better for others? Some days it can feel impossible. But I hold onto the words of Henry David Thoreau: "If you have built castles in the air, your work need not be lost; that is where they should be. Now put foundations under them." Yes, it is possible. It will take work—and faith—but the foundation can be built.

As Chanukah and the holiday season approach, may we bring our own light to the darkness and be illuminated by the light of others: through the candles burning in the Chanukiah, through strings of lights on houses and yards, through Christmas trees twinkling in windows, and through stars in the night sky. These combined lights remind us that we part of something greater.

Carrying this analogy further, every candle on our menorah adds light and warmth, just as each of you strengthens the spirit and success of Temple Emanuel Sinai.







SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE

Got Sneakers?

As young students (with their quickly growing feet) prepared for a new school year the Social Action Committee offered an athletic shoes recycling program. Your generous donations of used sneakers, many of them in very good condition, were passed along to our partners at Got Sneakers? Most of these were kept out of landfills and incinerators and the sneakers earned a small financial donation to the TES Greening Initiative, a program which seeks to reduce our institutional and communal waste and to limit environmental harm.

High Holy Day Food Drive

Our long running annual fall food drive straddles holy days of repentance and fasting, and the celebration of gratitude for ethical instruction in scripture and a harvest of food abundance. We especially sought (and often received) donations of food that had cultural resonance to the personal or ancestral origins of many of those in need. Once again we worked in partnership with Rachel's Table, a program of the Jewish Federation of Central Massachusetts, and with the South Worcester Neighborhood Center's food pantry.

Dignity, Not Deportations

Hundreds of people are being abducted daily by militarized and masked ICE agents without any due process. Under Massachusetts law government officials can partner with ICE by aiding in arrests or providing jail cells. A state bill called Dignity, Not Deportations would remove that discretion. We are working to influence legislators with the TES Racial Justice Alliance and our allies at JALSA (the Jewish Alliance for Law and Social Action) and at RAC MA (the Massachusetts affiliate of the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism).

Use of Kitchen Durables

A few years ago, thanks to many generous congregant donations, the TES Greening Initiative was able to acquire attractive and matching complete place settings for about 150 people. Along with a high-speed dishwasher and food composting capacity this makes it possible for us to minimize kitchen waste and single use disposables. These dishes, glasses, and silverware are used consistently for some TES sponsored programs. They are also usually available at no cost for use at TES for a shiva, simcha, and at other programs.


