



A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE

Forging a New Path

In January and February, our Torah portions come from the book of Exodus, a story we often think of as dramatic and decisive. Plagues. A sea split in two. Freedom won in a single, breathtaking moment.

But Exodus is also a story about beginnings. And beginnings are rarely clean or simple.

The Israelites leave Egypt not because everything ahead is clear, but because staying has become unbearable. And yet, even when a place is unhealthy, leaving it still involves grief. There is loss in every transition. Something is always left behind, even when what we leave behind was never genuinely good for us.

That truth feels deeply familiar. Many of us know what it is like to step out of a “comfort zone” that was never actually comfortable. To try to change patterns that no longer serve us: thought to move forward, the journey can feel exhausting and slow.

Sometimes it feels like walking through deep, shifting sand. Each step forward sinks under our feet. We push ahead, then slide back. The landscape around us looks the same no matter how much effort we expend. And sometimes we stop moving altogether, not because we don’t care, but because we are tired; because change feels like too much work; because we simply don’t have the energy.

There is wisdom, and compassion, in naming how we feel with honesty.

Changing patterns isn’t only emotional or spiritual; it is physical as well. To change how we think or act is to form new neurological pathways. We have worn deep grooves in the old routes, and when we are stressed or depleted, we naturally default to the ground already prepared for us. The old path is familiar; it’s easier to walk and even has sentimental stopping points. The memories, landmarks, and mileposts make us hesitate before leaving it behind.

Forging a new path takes effort and patience. And it often takes more time than we wish it would.

The Torah does not rush the Israelites through the wilderness. Neither should we rush ourselves. Exodus reminds us that liberation is not a single moment, but a long, uneven journey. Even standing still, at times, is part of learning how to move forward.

May we honor our own pace and trust that even slow steps count.

K-2: Torah Stories & Kindness

Our youngest students have been exploring early Torah stories and discovering Jewish values like *chesed* (kindness) and *shmirat habriyah* (caring for creation). Through songs, crafts, and storytelling, students are building a foundation of Jewish identity and Hebrew vocabulary.

Grades 3-5: Jewish Heroes & Holiday Exploration

Students are learning about heroes from Jewish history and the Torah while practicing how these values show up in their own lives. We're also continuing to strengthen Hebrew reading skills through small-group work and engaging language games.

Grades 6-7: B'nei Mitzvah Journey

Our older students are deepening their understanding of prayer, Torah, and personal responsibility as they prepare for their B'nei Mitzvah. They're also participating in meaningful discussions about Jewish ethics and what it means to be part of a sacred community.

Tu B'Shvat Celebration

Tu B'Shvat is the Birthday of the Trees! Activities in our school will include planting projects, fruit tastings, and learning about environmental stewardship from a Jewish perspective.

- Classes discussed ways we can bring more acts of kindness into our community and homes.
- Hebrew reading groups have been showing impressive growth — keep up the practice!
- Our older students began writing reflections on what becoming a B'nei Mitzvah means to them.

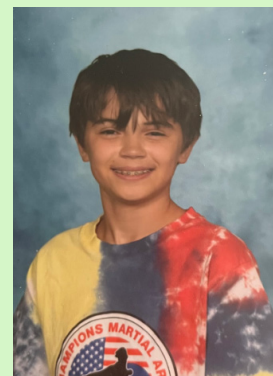

B'NAI MITZVAH THOUGHTS

A few years ago, I consulted Rabbi Google to learn when *Chaye Sarah* would be read in 2025, the year I would turn 83. To my surprise and delight, it would be on my 83rd birthday, November 15th. I asked Rabbi Valerie to reserve the date for me. In 1955, I had chanted *Chaye Sarah* in my family's Shul in Milton, MA and if I would ever have a second Bar Mitzvah, that, for sure, would be the date. Obviously physical and mental health would have to hold up for me to be able to pull it off.

I started working with Rabbi Valerie last Spring. She introduced me to "TropeTrainer", a web-based program that helps one learn to chant Torah and Haftorah. What a change from the 78 rpm record I used 70 years ago!

Thanks to Rabbi Valerie's pushing, prodding and help, and a lot of practice, practice, practice, I was able to chant the *maftir* Aliyah and a portion of the Haftorah. While I was certain that I would never even attempt to read the Haftorah from a scroll, Rabbi Valerie showed me that I could! And I did! I was able to lead much of the worship service.

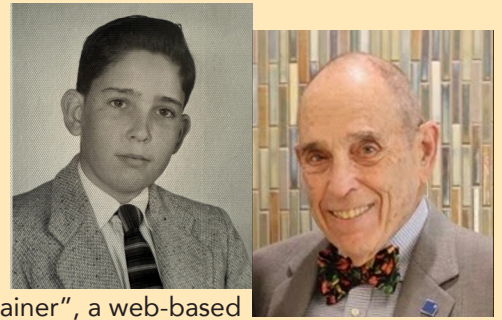
Together, we were able to design elements of the service to include family in a very meaningful way. The Torah passing *I'dor v dor* that is part of Bar/Bat Mitzvah services was done in reverse, passing the Torah from the youngest to the oldest, signifying how we teach but we also learn. Several members of my family participated in the service. My wife Judy, our grandson Theo and our nephew Ian all read Torah. Our children and grandchildren led parts of the service. Everyone welcomed the opportunity to be part of the day! Judy gave me a very meaningful and lovely 'charge'. And Judy and nephew Rick Gansler put together an amazing book of tributes from family and dear friends that I will cherish always.

What is the take-away from this amazing experience?

- I pushed myself to achieve what I never thought I could. That's not something we expect as we enter our 80's.
- I was able to express my thoughts about the lessons of *Chaye Sarah* and how they translate into our lives.
- It was a wonderful opportunity to gather family and community in a way for a joyous *simcha*.
- I learned, once again, what a wonderful, supportive community Temple Emanuel Sinai and the Worcester Jewish community is.
- I am truly blessed to be part of this family and this community.

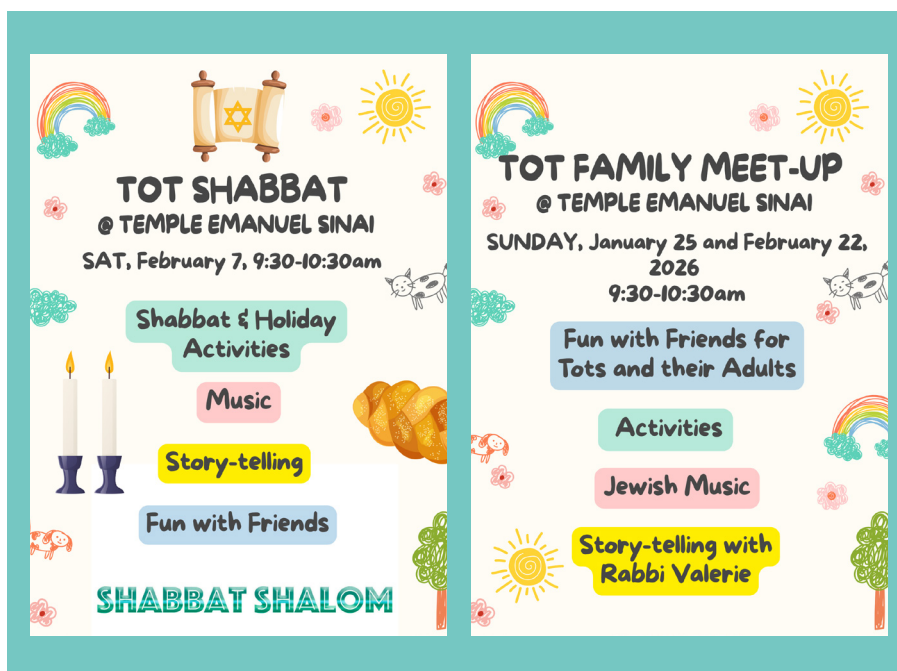

You can leave unopened and non-perishable food on the designated table in the TES lobby to give to food pantries through our partners at Rachel's Table. You can make or salvage home or restaurant or cater dishes including leftovers and donate those through Woofridge.org. Or you can make a financial donation by going to emanuelsinai.org. Once there click on "donations & payments", then "payments and donations portal," and then, under "type" click on "Food Insecurity Donation." This financial support is distributed regularly to trusted frontline agencies in our community. Any amount makes a difference.

We also continue our educational and public policy work most especially on ICE, immigrants, and refugees, on housing affordability, and on climate change and energy. 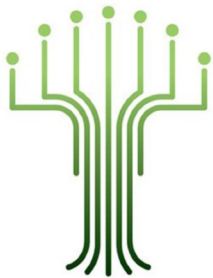
