



A NOTE FROM RABBI VALERIE

A Mixed Multitude: A Blessing of Diversity Within Community

There's a detail in the Exodus story that we often rush past. When our ancestors left Egypt, the Torah tells us that an *erev rav*, a "mixed multitude," went up with them (Exodus 12:38). Not just Israelites. A vast, diverse crowd of people, different in origin, in culture, in language, in story, walking together toward freedom and a new society.

The "mixed multitude" that went with us out of Egypt tells us something important: diversity was part of our origin story. When God spoke at Sinai, a midrash says, the voice divided itself into seventy languages so that every person present — in all their differences — could understand. Everyone heard. Everyone belonged. Everyone received Torah.

That's the community we come from. That's *kehillah* — the Hebrew word for community — at its deepest.

Kehillah is more than just a group of Jews who are together by proximity or a common interest. A *kehillah* is something much richer: a community bound together by collective responsibility, by genuine relationship, by the commitment that no one walks alone. The tradition teaches *kol Yisrael arevim zeh bazeh*, "all of us are guarantors for one another" (Talmud, Shevuot 39a). We are, in the most profound sense, responsible for each other's belonging, responsible for making sure that everyone who walks through our doors feels that this place is theirs.

This kind of community doesn't happen automatically. It requires something from us, a willingness to create and be present in relationships.

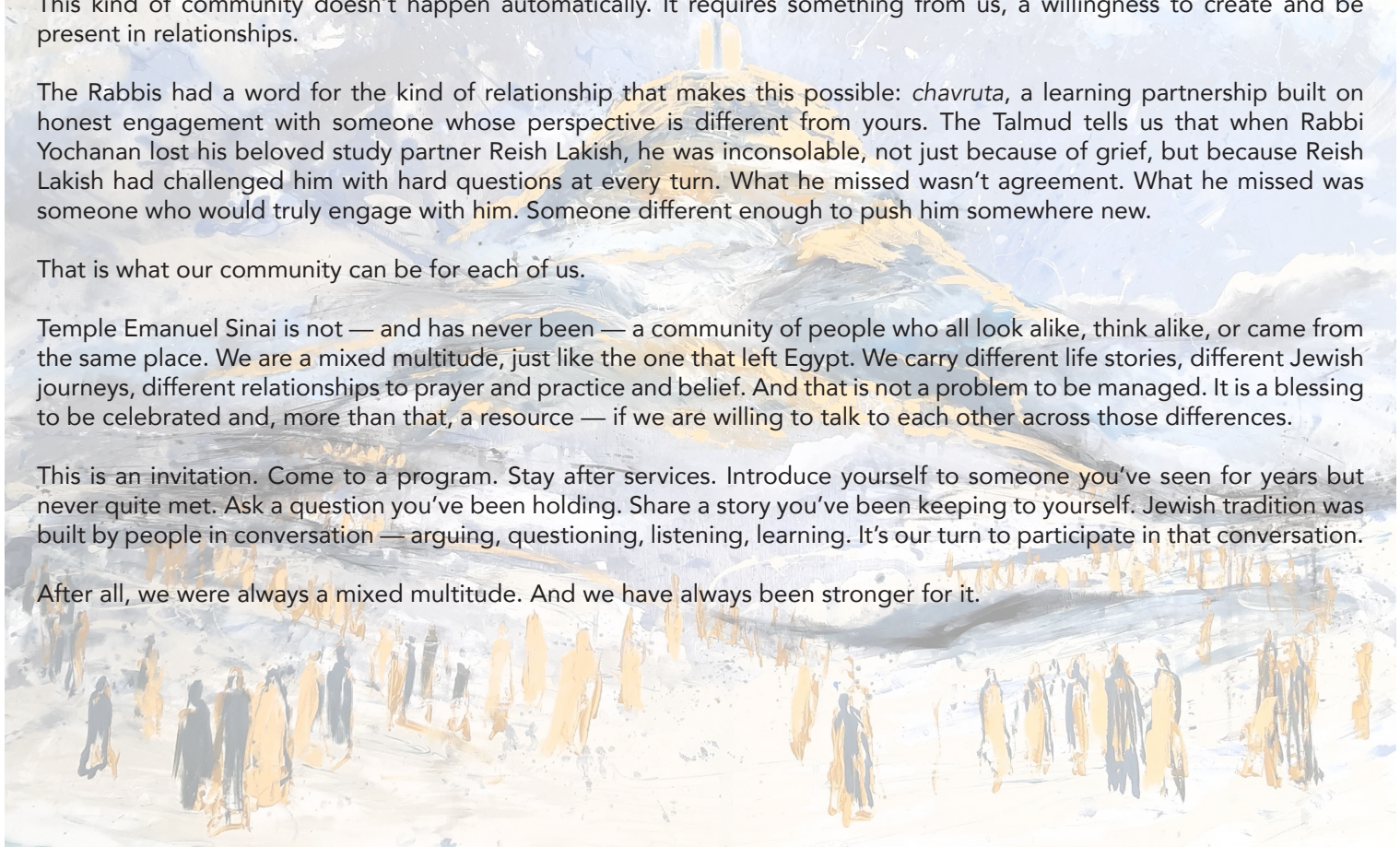
The Rabbis had a word for the kind of relationship that makes this possible: *chavruta*, a learning partnership built on honest engagement with someone whose perspective is different from yours. The Talmud tells us that when Rabbi Yochanan lost his beloved study partner Reish Lakish, he was inconsolable, not just because of grief, but because Reish Lakish had challenged him with hard questions at every turn. What he missed wasn't agreement. What he missed was someone who would truly engage with him. Someone different enough to push him somewhere new.

That is what our community can be for each of us.

Temple Emanuel Sinai is not — and has never been — a community of people who all look alike, think alike, or came from the same place. We are a mixed multitude, just like the one that left Egypt. We carry different life stories, different Jewish journeys, different relationships to prayer and practice and belief. And that is not a problem to be managed. It is a blessing to be celebrated and, more than that, a resource — if we are willing to talk to each other across those differences.

This is an invitation. Come to a program. Stay after services. Introduce yourself to someone you've seen for years but never quite met. Ask a question you've been holding. Share a story you've been keeping to yourself. Jewish tradition was built by people in conversation — arguing, questioning, listening, learning. It's our turn to participate in that conversation.

After all, we were always a mixed multitude. And we have always been stronger for it.

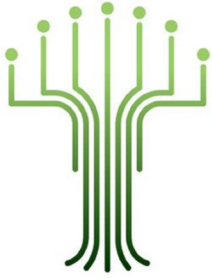
